#BEBRAVE GLOBAL SURVIVORS ACTION SUMMIT

Our Founder Tabitha participated in the April 27th Global Survivors Action Summit to lay plans to end childhood sexual violence on a global level. She was joined by singer and survivor Gloria Estefan, World Health Organization (WHO) Director General, Dr. Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus, Commissioner European Commission, Yllva Johansson, and other survivor/allies demanding bold and transformative action ASAP by governments and private sector leaders.

During the Summit, assault survivors led discussions of urgent actions needed to provide prevention, healing, and justice in east Africa and other parts of the world. Tabitha, a co-founder of the Brave Movement, also functions as the Lead Community Manager of SAGE--Survivor Advocates Globally Empowered--a powerful group of 15 survivor leaders representing the Brave Movement in almost every region of the world where multiple forms of sexual violence occur.

TOGETHER TO #ENDVIOLENCE

In June, Tabitha joined by Paul Zietz and Wibke Müller, also leaders of the Brave Movement, attended the Together to #ENDViolence event hosted by the Fund to End Violence Against Children.

During the We Protect Summit, hosted by the European Union, Tabitha and thought leaders around the world gathered to develop a coordinated global response for online child sexual exploitation and abuse. The exciting result; European Union Commissioner, Ylva Johansson, announced the Commission's commitment to protect children through newly proposed legislation that aims to protect children who've experienced Online Sexual Exploitation of Children (OSEC).

During the Together to #ENDviolence Leaders' event online, Tabitha and other leaders shared their calls to action to include the hashtag #ENDviolence among the other goals of the 2030 United Nations Sustainable Development Agenda. End Violence Against Children is an alliance that aims to end child sexual violence globally by raising 1 billion dollars for the cause.

Survivors of childhood sexual violence representing the Brave Movement also shared their powerful experiences, hopes, and demands, as did Ursula von der Leven, President of the European Commission.

The African Union Task Force will name and assemble survivor-leaders and their networks that have proven track records for advocacy across the continent of Africa.

Focused on transformational change, its members will be bound by a common purpose: to create a world where children and adolescents can grow up without the threat of sexual violence.
